

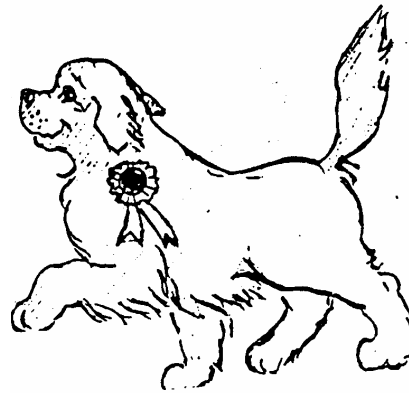

What is the Canine Health Information Center (CHIC)?

CHIC is a database of consolidated health screening results from multiple sources. Co-sponsored by the OFA (Orthopedic Foundation for Animals) and the AKC Canine Health Foundation, CHIC works with parent clubs to identify health screening protocols appropriate for individual breeds. Dogs tested in accordance with the parent club established requirements, that have their results registered and made available in the public domain are issued CHIC numbers.

The CHIC DNA Repository began in September of 2005 as a pilot program with the Golden Retriever Club of America. An overwhelming success, during the six months of the pilot phase, over 750 Golden Retriever DNA samples, as well as corresponding pedigrees and health histories, were submitted. The samples covered a wide spectrum and included young and old dogs, show dogs, field dogs, pets, and both healthy and diseased dogs.

Do test results have to be normal? No, CHIC is not about normalcy. CHIC is meant to encourage health testing and sharing of all results, normal and abnormal, so that more informed breeding decisions can be made in an overall effort to reduce the incidence of genetic disease and improve canine health.

What is the purpose of the CHIC DNA Repository? The CHIC DNA Repository, co-sponsored by the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) and the AKC Canine Health Foundation (AKC CHF), collects and stores canine DNA samples along with corresponding pedigree and health history information to facilitate future research and testing aimed at reducing the incidence of inherited disease in dogs. The program objectives are:

- Facilitate more rapid research progress by expediting the sample collection process
- Provide researchers with optimized family groups needed for research
- Allow breeders to take advantage of future DNA based disease tests as they become available
- Foster a team environment between breeders/owners and the research community improving the likelihood of genetic discovery

Who has access to the samples? Any legitimate research project focusing on canine health is eligible to receive samples. However, since the samples are finite, each project must be approved prior to sample distribution. An application form must be completed for all sample requests. The approval process is streamlined for research funded by either the AKC CHF or the Morris Animal Foundation since the project would have already passed a scientific review board during the funding process. For all other projects, the OFA and the AKC CHF will jointly assemble an appropriate review committee to evaluate the merits of the research and the request.

Can owners/parent clubs direct sample use? Sample use is directed solely by the bank's administrators: the OFA and the AKC CHF. Owners and parent clubs are welcome to contact the bank about potential research opportunities and should encourage researchers with whom they have direct relationships to apply for sample use. However, the final decision rests with the bank.

There is one exception. If a DNA-based disease test becomes available in the future, owners may request that any remaining samples of their dogs be forwarded to the appropriate licensed lab for testing. The owner remains responsible for any lab costs associated with the test itself, as well as the direct costs to prepare and ship the sample.

Who owns the samples? Once owners donate their dogs' DNA to the CHIC DNA bank, the samples are the property of the CHIC DNA Repository. Individuals donating samples have no claims to any future financial gain due to commercial invention, royalties, or patents that may be developed as a result of research which utilized their dog's samples.

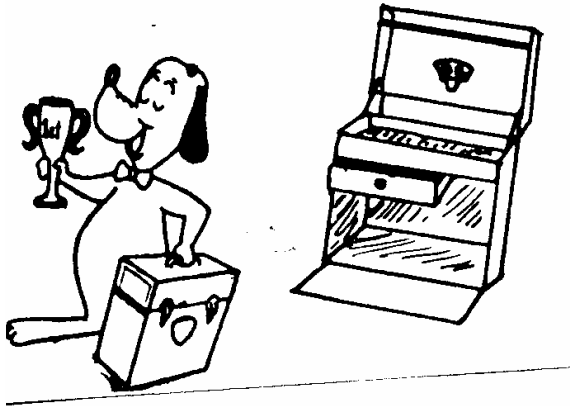
Sharing more information will help demystify the role of the test committee, and hopefully encourage more club members to get involved in working at working events.

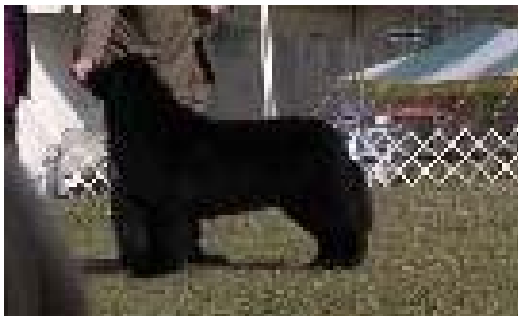

BONE APPETIT!

OATMEAL MINI-MUFFINS FOR DOGS (Yields about 2 dozen. These freeze well.)

From Debbie O'Hara of Biscuits Dog Bakery in Pittsford, N.Y.

2 cups whole-wheat flour	1/4 cup powdered milk
1/2 teaspoon baking soda	1 cup oatmeal
1/4 cup vegetable oil	2 cups water

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Mix all ingredients into a batter.

Spray mini-muffin tin with cooking oil spray.

Fill muffin tin chambers three-quarters full.

Bake for 20 to 25 minutes.

Cool on rack.

NOTE: To make Pup Cakes use oversized muffin pan and bake for 40 minutes.

Make a frosting by mixing 8 ounces low-fat cream cheese (soften first in microwave for 30 seconds) and 18 ounce jar of creamy peanut butter with a metal spoon. Yields six cakes.

Guidelines for High Country Newfoundland Club ANNUAL AWARDS

Rev. 5/2005

Awards are given on a calendar year basis when possible. Years cannot be combined when applying for an award. Any points, wins, etc. that were used in the previous year's awards tallies are not eligible to be used a second time. If wins occur after the cut-off date for applying for annual awards they may be used for the next year's time period.

Note: All applications for awards must contain the name of the show, date, win/leg, title, points/score, etc. as well as the or actual publication of title(s) in the AKC Show Results; dog's name, owner/co-owner, breeder, as well as the and any other required information required for each category listed, as published herein. Awards are open to all General, Honorary and Junior members, as defined in the By-Laws; Affiliate members (out-of-region) are eligible to receive awards (only as decided by the Board).

Owner or co-owner shall include immediate members as defined by AKC.

Owner-Handler Awards:

When compiling information for owner-handler awards, please list each dog and its wins separately.

Owner-Handler (Conformation) - Person putting the most points on dogs they own or co-own and show themselves. Ties to be broken by most major points - total major points.

Owner-Handler (Obedience) - Person putting the most legs and/or points from qualifying scores on dogs they own or co-own. Scores and obedience trials must be included for eligibility.

Owner-Handler (NCA Working Titles) - Minimum of two titles. Person putting the most working titles on dogs - may or may not be on the same dog - but must be owner or co-owner handled.

Owner-Handler (Tracking) - Person successfully passing the most AKC tracking tests with dogs they own or co-own.

Owner-Handler (Agility) - Person successfully passing the most AKC agility tests with dogs they own or co-own.

Owner-Handler (Rally) - Person successfully passing the most AKC rally tests with dogs they own or co-own.

AKC/NCA TITLES AND OTHER AWARDS:

Titles offered by the AKC and any other registry the AKC acknowledges as an "official" registry shall be recognized. These include but are not limited to Mexican, International, English, and Canadian. Titles offered by NCA shall also be recognized.

Obedience Title - Obtained with qualifying scores in the "first three attempts". Owned or co-owned by members.

New Champions - Dogs owned or co-owned by members. AKC, Cdn. etc.

New Obedience Titles - Dogs owned or co-owned by members. AKC, Cdn., etc.

New NCA Working Titles - Dogs owned or co-owned by members.

New Tracking Titles - Dogs owned or co-owned by members.

AKC Agility Title - Dogs owned or co-owned by members.

AKC Rally Title - Dogs owned or co-owned by members.

Stud Dog - Minimum of two Champion Get. Ties to be broken by obedience and working/tracking titles.

Brood Bitch - Minimum of two Champion Get. Ties to be broken by obedience and working/tracking titles.

Breeder of a Champion - For breeder of a Champion - US or other. Awarded only if the breeder is an HCNC member, as defined above. If the breeder is also the owner - one award plaque will be awarded and shall read - "Breeder/Owner (or co-owner) of ..."

Group Placements - A Newf placing in the Working Group will receive an award. If multiples placements are achieved, the total number will be indicated on the award.

Best in Show - A Newf receiving a BIS or BISS will receive an award. If multiple BISs are attained the total number will be indicated on the award.

Living Legends - Newfs owned or co-owned by members who reached the age of 10 yrs. during the current award year. Include date of birth and dog's registered name.

In Memoriam - Include dog's name, date of birth, date of death.

The following awards are available to Junior HCNC members. Juniors must be exhibiting a Newf and be 18 years of age or under, as defined by AKC, to qualify for these awards.

Top Junior Showperson - Junior with the most NCA points in Jr. showmanship. If none, the Junior with the most placements in regular conformation shows (Jr. showmanship competition only) will be awarded this plaque.

NCA Working Dog Title,
AKC Championship, Obedience, Tracking, Rally or Agility or any other AKC Title
AKC Championship

The Junior who applies for any of the above awards must exclusively handle the Newf to the completion of the applicable title in order to qualify. Owner or co-owned shall be as defined by AKC.

HCNC offers an award the following awards in recognition of all first place wins placements at the NCA National Specialty shows:

First place only - This includes but is not limited to both regular and non-regular classes as well as obedience, rally, agility and other working events.

Any dog owned or co-owned by an HCNC member that achieves Best of Breed, Winners Dog/Bitch, Best of Winners, Best in Sweepstakes, or High Scoring Dog in Trial are also to be awarded special recognition.

the following conformation categories (dogs and bitches):

- Sweepstakes - all classes
- All regular dog and bitch classes
- Winners Dog/Bitch
- Veteran Dog/Bitch
- Stud Dog/Brood Bitch
- Working Dog/Bitch
- Best of Breed
- Best of Opposite Sex to Breed
- Best of Winners
- Newf Brace/Team
- Select Dog/Bitch

First Place Only in the following Regular Obedience Classes - Novice A, Novice B, Open A, Open B, Utility.

First Place Only in the following Non-regular Obedience Classes - Graduate Novice, Veteran Obedience, Brace Obedience, Team Obedience.

Junior Showmanship - for the first place in the following - Novice Junior Class, Novice Senior Class, Open Junior Class, Open Senior Class, Best Junior Handler at a National Specialty.

The following recognitions by the NCA will also be given an award by HCNC:

- Register of Merit (ROM)
- Versatile Newfoundland (VN)
- Top Winning Conformation Dog/Bitch

In addition, HCNC may choose to give an award for any dog owned or co-owned by an HCNC member whose dog ranks in the top 20 in either breed or obedience according to the NCA counting system. Special attention should be given to those dogs who are also owner-handled to their wins.

HCNC will consider giving an award for other titles earned by Newfs, such as flyball, search and rescue, etc. The owner must

apply proof of title from the organization awarding the title. These titles must be earned by training for and qualifying in actual tested events. They do and do not include such things as certificates of temperament, therapy dog, CGC, etc. Each title will be considered for an award by the HCNC Board of Directors on an individual basis, with each decision by the Board being final.

Note: Dogs receiving two or more titles in one year (CH, CD, DD, etc.) will receive only one plaque listing all titles achieved for that year; and will be recognized verbally during the presentation of awards in all categories. Individual plaques will not be awarded for each title obtained.

Participation Awards - are given for various categories. Sometimes the person(s) receives the award and sometimes the dog (s) receive it, or both are recognized on the same plaque. Some examples are -- chairpersons, stewards, matches, carting/parade participants, community service, etc. as well as other club functions/activities requiring member/Newf participation.

No awards will be mailed unless prior arrangements are made with the chairperson. You must either attend the banquet or make arrangements for someone in attendance to pick them up for you.

Fun Awards - if you know of any person/event/etc. that may qualify for one of these awards, please let the participation awards chair know. Can be just about anything!
